The McCall MacBain Scholarships are Canada's first comprehensive, leadership-driven scholarships for master's and professional degree studies.

Funded in perpetuity, the McCall MacBain Scholarships are the result of a \$200-million gift by John and Marcy McCall MacBain and their Foundation in 2019. At the time, it was the largest single donation in Canadian history.

The McCall MacBain Foundation's mission is to improve the welfare of humanity by providing scholarships and other educational opportunities that nurture transformational leadership, and by investing in evidence-based strategies to address climate change, preserve the natural environment, and improve health outcomes. The Foundation is a Second-Century Founder of the Rhodes Trust, aiding its global expansion since 2013, and the Second Decade Founder of the Mandela Rhodes Scholarships in South Africa.

Scholarship Program

The McCall MacBain Scholarships are about much more than financial support. We believe in the power of community. This program brings together a diverse group of scholars who aspire to lead with purpose – individuals who have demonstrated leadership potential and an inner drive to make a positive impact in other people's lives.

While scholars will go on to work on a broad range of challenges in different sectors, they share a vision for the kind of leaders they want to be: leaders who serve others with integrity and humility, who are committed to continual learning and bridge-building, and who take bold, meaningful risks.

McCall MacBain Scholars pursue fully funded master's and professional degrees at McGill University in Montréal, Canada. The scholarship covers tuition and fees for the full normal duration of the academic program, a living stipend of \$2,000 CAD per month during academic terms, and a relocation grant for moving to Montréal.



Leadership Skills **Development**

McCall MacBain Scholars participate in an intensive leadership development program to learn how to tackle complex challenges and deepen their impact. Together, they develop their understanding of themselves, of others, and of the systems that affect us all.

During bi-weekly seminars, scholars review and discuss interdisciplinary leadership cases. The case studies allow students to learn about and discuss different types of leadership challenges. Case studies include crisis communication, design thinking, innovation, negotiation, networking, and more. Guest speakers are invited to share their insights with the group.

Each seminar includes a leadership lab, where scholars seek constructive feedback and ideas from their peers regarding a real-life leadership challenge they have faced.



Meaningful Connections

Every scholar is matched with a supportive and experienced mentor, a professional coach, a faculty advisor, and other advisors. These individuals challenge McCall MacBain Scholars to reach their goals and set new ones, while introducing them to a broader network of people.

Our mentors are leaders in business, academia, government, and the social services sector. They are matched with scholars based on individual goals, interests, and areas for growth.

Coaching begins with an individual strengths assessment, followed by monthly one-on-one meetings with a coach. Faculty advisors support our scholars' overall transition to the McGill community. In addition, community advisors are introduced for specific conversations.

Mentor Profile: Joanne Liu

Dr. Joanne Liu is a Canadian pediatric emergency room physician, former International President of Médecins Sans Frontières/Doctors Without Borders (MSF), and a professor at McGill's School of Population and Global Health. A graduate of the McGill Medicine class of 1991, Joanne first joined MSF in 1996, working with Malian refugees in Mauritania. Since then, she has provided and coordinated emergency medical aid across the globe, whether it be resulting from natural disasters like tsunamis or earthquakes or viral outbreaks such as Ebola in 2014. As a member of the Independent Panel on Pandemic Preparedness and Response, Joanne has been contributing to a set of comprehensive recommendations to protect people from future outbreaks. Recently, she was conferred an Honorary Fellowship by the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.



Montréal, Canada

Montréal is one of the top student destinations in the world, known for its open, creative culture and exceptional quality of life. It's the second-largest city in Canada with direct flights to 130+ cities worldwide.

First Global Cohort

September 2023 will mark the arrival of the first global cohort of McCall MacBain Scholars, following two years of Canadianonly applications. The expanded cohort will consist of 20 Canadians and 10 international students.

With most McCall MacBain Scholars pursuing multi-year master's or professional degrees, up to 75 scholars will be studying on campus at any given time.

ADMISSIONS

Our selection committees look for exceptional students who strive to engage in positive change by taking on meaningful leadership roles.


Applicants must meet the minimum degree and language requirements for McGill master's program admission. They must also meet the requirements for the McGill program(s) they list in their scholarship application.

Application Process

The McCall MacBain Scholarship application is comprehensive and includes two reference forms. For international applicants, the online application will be available from early June to late August.

UNIVERSITY ENDORSEMENT

Current students and recent graduates must earn the endorsement of their university. Guidance will be available in the online application.

MCGILL ADMISSIONS

This scholarship application is separate from and earlier than McGill graduate admissions. Since program admission timelines and requirements vary, applicants are strongly encouraged to research the ones that interest them.

Applicants must apply directly to McGill programs by the program deadline, or in December 2022 at the latest if selected for McCall MacBain Scholarship final interviews.



*It is also possible to apply for eligible programs that start in the summer (May - August 2023).

Interviews

Volunteers in Canada and around the world contribute their time to help select scholars.

Regional interviews will be conducted online in October and November for applicants outside of Canada and the United States. At these interviews, more than 200 Canadian and international semifinalists will be invited to reflect on their personal experiences, volunteer and leadership contributions, and goals.

The interviewers may include business executives, academics, public servants, and other active community leaders. Collectively, they will have professional or personal connections to the world region for which they are conducting interviews.

Afterwards, up to 50 Canadian and 30 international finalists will be invited to Montréal for final interviews. Travel and accommodation costs are covered for participation in final interviews.

Candidates who participate in interviews are eligible for additional awards. Up to 20 Finalist Awards of \$20,000 CAD will be offered to international applicants attending final interviews in Montréal.
